

# How to Separate and Dispose of Garbage

**Do not leave your garbage at any garbage collection places in other areas.**

Please separate your garbage properly and put it out at the designated collection place by 8:00 a.m. on the collection day.

★ Recyclables such as wrapping paper, paper boxes and envelopes are mixed in the burnable garbage. Let's sort and recycle our garbage.

★ To reduce garbage: ① Bring eco-bags; ② Use refillable products; ③ Refuse over-packaging

## What the Town Collects (Garbage from home)

### Garbage to be crushed, landfilled, incinerated

\* Combustible waste is dried and converted to Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF) for use in a dedicated power generation facility. \* Iron becomes a resource when crushed.

<b>Burnable garbage</b> Twice a week	Drain out the water well. Raw waste Waste paper Vinyls, plastics Fabrics, leather products Wood chipboards Plants Others	Put burnable garbage in a transparent or translucent bag with the contents visible and attach a garbage disposal ticket or use the Shika Town garbage designated bag to put it out. Please do not put it out in cardboard.
<b>Non-burnable garbage</b> Once every two weeks	No fires Please use up the contents. Metals Kettles Light bulbs Glasses and glass containers Ceramics Sand, ash Cassette tapes, video tapes Plastic helmets Dispose of them with burnable garbage	Please remove batteries and fuel. Be sure to use up the spray can contents and remove the gas. Remove the contents from paint cans.
<b>Bulk Waste</b> Four times a year	Oversized garbage is combustibles that do not fit in garbage bags up to 45 liters, and incombustibles that do not fit in non-burnable garbage collection containers.	Please put out a paid oversized garbage disposal ticket. Please remove batteries and fuel.

### Garbage that becomes a resource

* Small home appliances are recycled as metal resources <b>Small home appliances</b> Once every two weeks	When you dispose of a personal computer, mobile phone, digital camera, etc., delete the data. Small home appliances	Please remove batteries and fuel. Please consult with your dealer for items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Law.
* Plastics are recycled into rain gutters, fuel, etc. <b>Plastic containers and packages</b> Once a week	Those without this mark are burnable garbage Plastic bags Styrofoam Trays Plastic containers Plastic caps and lids Plastic products Dispose of plastic products with burnable garbage.	Separate the plastic waste containers and lids; put them in a transparent or translucent bag where the contents can be seen. If you can't get rid of dirt, put such waste out as burnable garbage.
* Paper recyclable waste are recycled into newspapers, magazines, etc. <b>Paper recyclable waste</b> Once every two weeks	Wash each carton with water, open it and dry it. Paper cartons Dispose of plastic spouts and the insides of silver-colored paper cartons as burnable garbage. Newspapers and inserts Cardboard Magazines and other papers Magazines and other papers should be bundled and tied up or put in a paper bag and put out. Dispose of wastepaper, rice bags, thermal paper, carbon paper, photographs, paper cups, waterproof paper, etc. with burnable garbage.	Please separate recyclable paper waste into four types (paper cartons, newspapers/inserts, corrugated cardboard, magazines/other papers) and put them out.
* Empty cans are recycled into new cans. <b>Empty cans</b> Once every two weeks	Remove the lids. Wash the cans with water. Cans for food and drink Spray and paint cans Dispose of spray and paint cans with non-burnable garbage.	Please dispose of the lids or pull-tops that come off the containers as non-burnable garbage.
* Empty bottles are recycled into new bottles <b>Empty bottles</b> Once every two weeks	Clear and colorless Brown Other colors Remove the lids. Wash the bottles with water. Bottles for food and drink Bottle lids Dispose of bottle lids in non-burnable garbage.	Please color-code empty bottles into 3 types (Clear and colorless, brown, and other colors) and put them out. Dispose of metal lids as non-burnable garbage.
* Plastic bottles are recycled into new clothing, etc. <b>Plastic bottles</b> Once every two weeks	Check the marks. Remove the caps. Wash the bottles with water. PET Plastic bottles are bottles with this mark. Cooking oil bottles Dispose of cooking oil bottles as plastic containers and packages.	Dispose of the plastic lids as plastic containers and packages. If you can't remove the dirt from the plastic bottles, put them out as burnable garbage.
* Clothes are mainly reused as used clothing <b>Clothes</b> Once every two weeks	Suits and jackets Pants Dress shirts Skirts Sweaters Jerseys/t-shirts Polo shirts T-shirts Vests Coats Sweatshirts Put your clothes in a transparent or translucent bag, close the bag so that the inside does not get wet, and take it to the resource waste collection site. Raincoats, anoraks, leather jumpers and the like Cotton padding clothes, hats, mufflers, gloves and the like Pieces of cloth, towels, sheets and the like Severely dirty, perforated, damp clothing, etc.	Nylon, vinyl, leather clothing, items that cannot be collected due to type or shape, items that are not clothing and items that are in poor condition should be disposed of as burnable garbage.
* For items that use mercury, metals such as zinc are reused. <b>Items that use mercury</b> Once every two weeks	Dry-cell batteries Rechargeable/button-type batteries Mirrors Thermometers Fluorescent light bulbs Dispose of broken fluorescent light bulbs, etc. with non-burnable garbage.	Dispose of light bulbs, glow starters for fluorescent lamps and broken fluorescent lamps in non-burnable garbage. Please dispose of large items such as full-length mirrors and mirror stands as oversized garbage.

<b>Business Waste</b>	• It is the responsibility of the business operator to dispose of the waste generated from their business establishment in accordance with the law. Please outsource industrial waste such as burnt waste, sludge, waste oil and construction waste generated by business to an industrial waste disposal company.	
<b>Garbage from agriculture, fisheries, construction, etc.</b>	• Please have a dealer or a contractor pick up garbage such as agricultural equipment, seedling boxes, PVC bags used in rice fields, pesticides and fishing nets.	<b>Carcasses of animals and pets</b> • Please consult with Hakui Funeral Home (☎22-0420) or a pet funeral home. (Bones are not returned to the owner at Hakui Funeral Home. 5,000 yen (excluding tax) per case)

If a large amount of garbage is generated due to moving or cleaning up, please bring the garbage directly to the Crinkle Hakui Recycling Center.
